

What is a cartel?

A cartel is an agreement between producers or suppliers of a good or service to fix prices and/or limit their production.

There are 4 main types of cartel conduct:

- (a) Price Fixing
- (b) Bid Rigging
- (c) Market Sharing
- (d) Production Controls

Why are cartels bad?

Cartels prevent competition since there is little or no incentive to lower prices or provide better quality goods or services. For example, economic studies have shown that cartels, on average, overcharge by 30%, thus raising costs. As a result, businesses and consumers are hurt and there is likely to be harm to the Singapore economy as well.

"FREED!" was intended to create awareness about the CCCS's Leniency Programme which was set up to encourage cartel members to come forward to provide information on cartels.

Are you in a cartel?

A cartel is an agreemnt between producers or supliers of a good or service to fix prices and/or limit production.

Cartels are bad as they prevent competition since there is little or no incentive for producers or suppliers to lower prices or provide better quality gods or services. As a result, businesses and consumers are hurt and there is harm to the Singapore economy.

If you are in a cartel, you should report the cartel activity under the CCCS's Leniency Programme.

What is the CCCS's Leniency Programme?

The CCCS's Leniency Prgramme offers an incentive to encourage a company or person(s) who have participated in a cartel to come forward and report the cartel activity. The first person or company that comes forward and provides evidence of such activities before CCCS starts investigation is granted full immunity from financial penalty.

How can CCCS help you if you spot a cartel?

Although cartels generally operate in secret, you may be in a position to spot them in your industry. You can alert CCCS and CCCS will investigate accordingly. CCCS has substantial investigation powers which it can exercise.


